WCHA classes are open to all registered stock horse breeds, all you need is proof of registration to become a member and start entering classes.

Classes offered Sunday included Limited divisions of mares and geldings in Amateur and Youth. To be eligible for these classes, the horse or exhibitor can not have placed in the top ten at the Congress or AQHA World Show.

Saturday, preceding the classes, was a halter and grooming clinic by Tim Finkenbinder, followed by an information session on WCHA.
